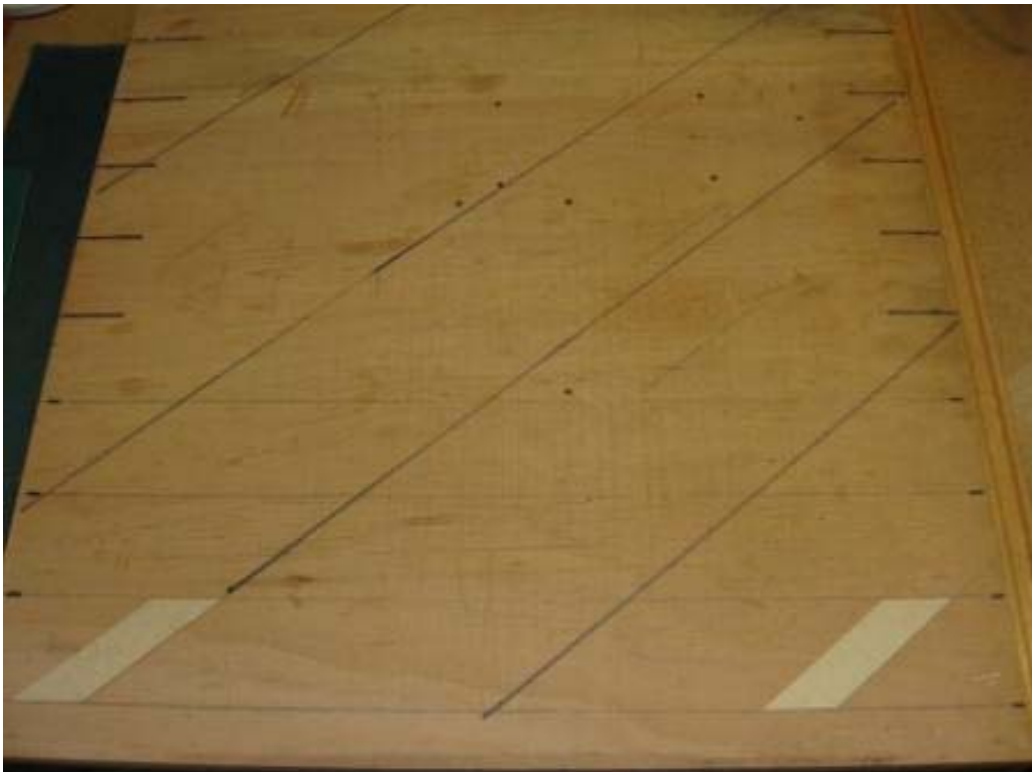


## One way of making streamers.....

### What you need:

Red streamer paper (forestry tape)  
Black streamer paper (forestry tape)  
Sisal string (High quality, 1.5 mm)  
Paper tape  
Fibre glass tape

1. Cut the strings. One roll of Swedish sisal string (500 grams) will give you 60 strings if you make them 3.3 metres. Make the ink mark 75 centimetres from one end. Being three persons when doing this will simplify things.
2. Cut the streamer paper. One roll of forestry tape will give you 30 streamers if you make them 2.50 metres. Also here it helps by being three persons.....
3. Prepare a wooden plate by drawing lines (to be used as a guide when you cut the paper tape with a razor blade). Note that the length of each paper tape piece is extended by 1 centimetre compared to the rule book. This is because it is folded (with 0.5 cm) when the fibre glass tape is attached. (The paper tape piece will be 11 cm long).



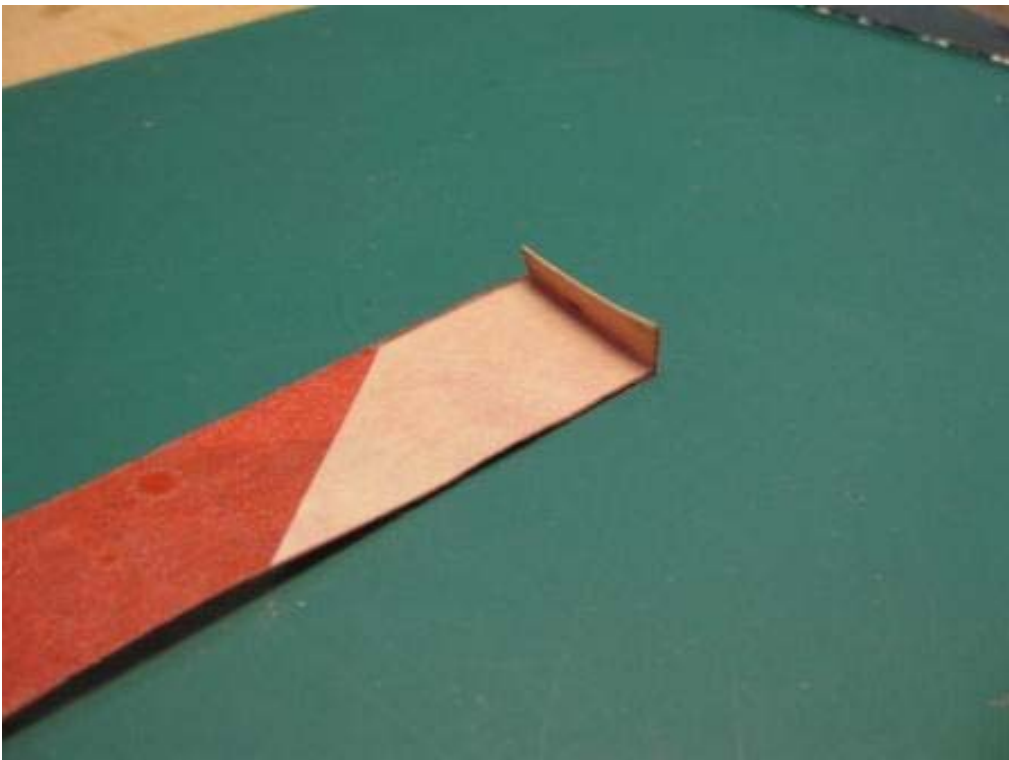
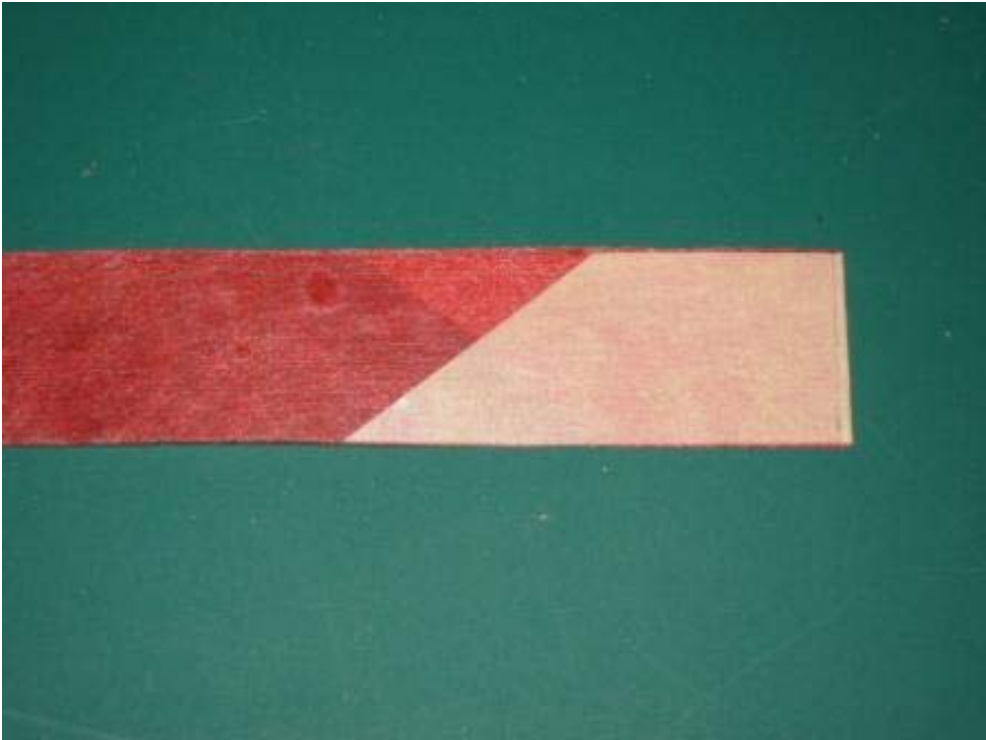
4. Attach as much tape to the wooden plate as you can fit. Cut it with a razor blade.



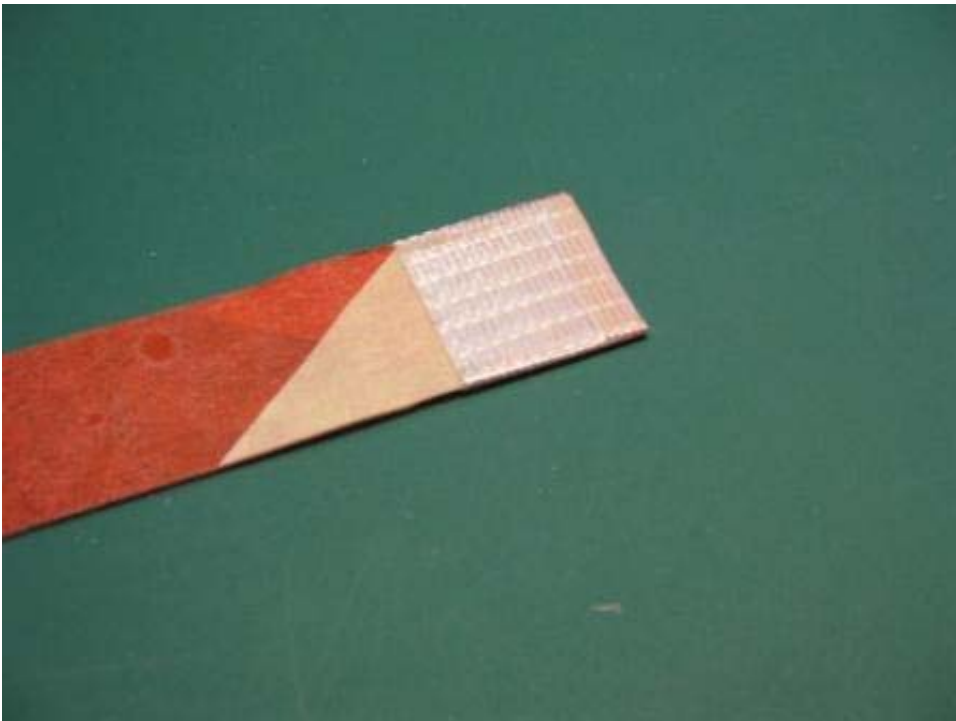
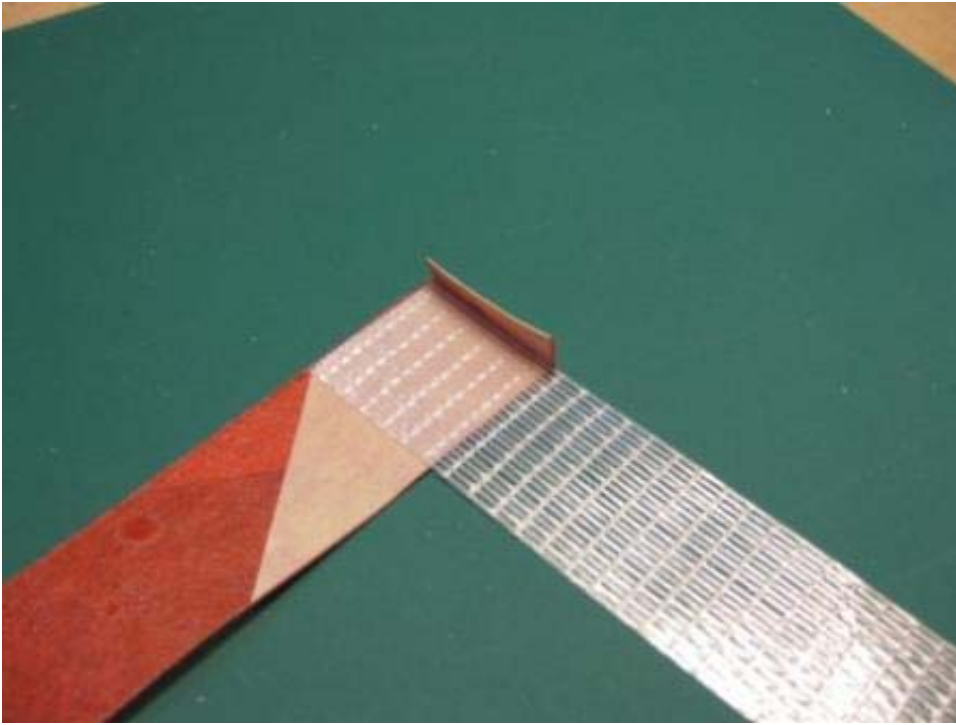
5. Attach the tape to the streamer. Let the tape stay on the wooden plate and attach one side at a time. This will make it easier than if you work on free hand with the tape.



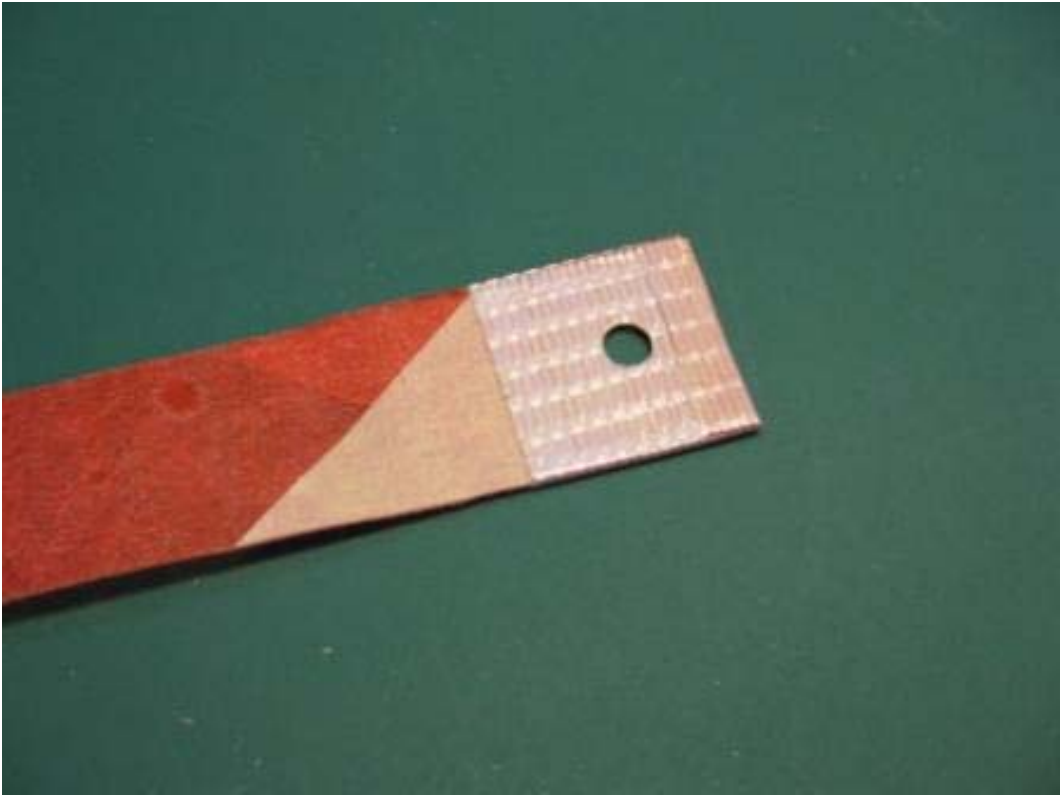
6. Fold the streamer/tape 0.5 centimetres from the end. This is to create a reinforcement to avoid the string being ripped out of the hole.



7. Attach the fibre glass tape. Two layers on each side will do. Start with the fibre glass tape and then fold the streamer paper before layer two of fibre glass tape is attached.



8. Make the hole for the string.



9. Attach the string and roll it together.
